- **A.** Yes, the Budget Review & Meet the Candidates meeting will be on Monday, March 20, at 7:00 p.m.

- Q. Where do I vote?
- **A.** You vote in the library on Tuesday, April 4, from 9:30 a.m. to 9:00 p.m.
- **Q.** Who is eligible to vote?
- **A.** All residents of the CSH School District who are registered to vote in the school district's annual budget vote are eligible to vote in the CSH Library election. Call Election Clerk Susan Tyska at (631) 692-6820, x501 for details.
- **Q.** I will be away on April 4. Can I get an absentee ballot?
- **A.** Yes, if you are unable to vote in person, you may apply for an absentee ballot. Applications will be available at the Circulation Desk and on our website after March 1.
