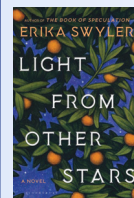

Budget Vote FAQs

Q. Where can I find more information about the 2020-2021 budget?

A. Complete details will be mailed. They will also be available at the Circulation Desk and on our website, www.cshlibrary.org, after March 2.

Q. Will there be a public meeting about the budget and to meet the candidates for the Board of Trustees?

A. Yes, the Budget Review & Meet the Candidates meeting will be on Monday, March 23 at 7:00pm

Q. Where do I vote?

A. You vote in the library on Tuesday, April 7 from 9:30am to 9:00pm.

Q. Who is eligible to vote?

A. All residents of the CSH School District who are registered to vote in the school district's annual budget vote are eligible to vote in the CSH Library election. Call Election Clerk, Susan Tyska, at (631) 692-6820, x501 for details.

Q. I will be away on April 7. Can I get an absentee ballot?

A. Yes, if you are unable to vote in person, you may apply for an absentee ballot. Applications will be available at the Circulation Desk and on our website after March 2.

ABOUT BOATING SAFELY

Saturdays, March 7, April 18, May 2, or June 6, 9:30am-5:00pm

The recently signed Briana's Law phases in requirements that all operators of motorized watercraft must complete a state-approved boating safety course. Under the phase-in, all motor boat operators born on or after January 1, 1993 must complete a safety course to operate a motor boat beginning in 2020.

This is a one-day, intensive instructional course to meet the NYS requirements to operate a boat in the waters of the State of New York. Adults and children 10 years old and up are invited to take this class. The fee is \$40, payable via PayPal during online registration. Students should bring a BAG LUNCH with them. Parents do not need to accompany their children, but are welcome to sit in. Please be aware that children are to be picked up at the library promptly at 5:00pm.
